### The entrance requirements for our Sixth Form in September 2024 are as follows:

- Admission to the Sixth Form is open to both internal and external candidates.
- To gain a place in Year 12, Sixth Form students must gain the following grades from their best 8 GCSE subjects (these must be full course GCSEs (not equivalents):
  - **Entry Tier 1- study Three full A Levels (for 2 years)**
    - Students will need 6 or more GCSE subjects at grade 6 or above Mathematics and English Language GCSE at grade 5 or above
  - In all subjects a minimum of a grade 6 at GCSE is required to study the subject at A Level. Access to certain courses will require a higher minimum level of entry (see Sixth Form Information booklet).
  - **Entry Tier 2- study Four full A Levels (for 2 years)**
    - Students will need 3 GCSE subjects at grade 8 and a further 3 GCSE subjects at grade 7 or above Mathematics and English Language GCSE at grade 5 or above
  - In all subjects a minimum of a grade 6 at GCSE is required to study the subject at A Level. Access to certain courses will require a higher minimum level of entry (see Sixth Form Information booklet).
  - For most A-Level courses it is advisable to have studied the same or a related course at GCSE.
  - You should not take more than two completely 'new' A-Level subjects – i.e. ones that you have not studied at GCSE.
- There are 4 Option Blocks (overleaf). Please select 1 A Level subject from **EACH** block that you wish to study from the list of available subjects below. If you are taking 3 A Levels, please only select 3 choices and leave one option block blank.
- If studying 4 subjects, please complete on next page, please ensure the subject fits alongside your other subjects in the blocks overleaf.

**Note 1:** A 'looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption (2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4) including those who appear to the admission authority to have been in state care outside England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

1. A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school. In Gloucestershire, such children are referred to as Children in Care.
2. This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children's Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).
3. Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014.
4. See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).
5. A child is regarded as having been in 'state care outside of England' if they were in the care of or were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation, or any other provider of care whose sole or main purpose is to benefit society.

**Note 2:** Children attracting Pupil Premium are those who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the six years prior to the closing date for registration for the Test. The School will require independent and verifiable evidence of Pupil Premium entitlement in the requisite period from a reliable source such as a local authority. The School will make such enquiries as are necessary of GCC (or the relevant Local Authority) as to the entitlement of any children who have qualified when notifying GCC of the test results.
